Upon notice duly given, the meeting of the State Allocation Board (SAB) was held at the State Capitol, Room 447, in Sacramento, California on December 6, 2017 at 1:00 p.m.

With a quorum present, Ms. Ortega, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:12 p.m.

PRIOR MINUTES

A motion was made, and carried, to approve two sets of SAB Minutes for the August 23, 2017 and September 6, 2017 meetings.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

Priority Funding Filing Round Now Open

The priority funding filing period closed on December 7, 2017. OPSC received 24 requests from 21 school districts for a total of \$37.4 million eligible to participate in this filing round. The applications will be valid from January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018. School districts were reminded that the requirements for participation in the Priority Funding Process are in effect under School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.90.3.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT (cont.)

Priority Funding Apportionments

September 6, 2017 Apportionments

The SAB approved 131 funding applications representing 68 school districts for a total of \$433.3 million in priority funding apportionments at its September 6, 2017 meeting. OPSC received 101 of the required 130 *Fund Release Authorization*, Forms SAB 50-05 as of Monday, November 27, 2017, with 29 waiting to be submitted. Updated information was provided that indicated only one project was not able to submit the required documentation, and as a result, received a new unfunded approval date.

New Reports in Financials Section

It was noted that new reports are reflected in the Financials section of the Agenda detailing Proposition 51 allocations.

Regulations Update

Regulations requiring Grant Agreements and the facilitation of the application submittal process for school districts seeking Financial Hardship funding became effective on September 20 and 22, 2017, respectively. Additionally, regulations restarting the Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) became effective on November 27, 2017.

Career Technical Education Facilities Program

The SAB established two CTEFP filing rounds at its August 23, 2017 meeting. California Department of Education (CDE) grant applications were due to CDE by November 29, 2017. Approximately 300 applications were received.

Online Funding Applications

It was stated that OPSC was developing new on-line options for the School Facility Program (SFP) applications. The long-term plan is to provide school districts the ability to submit eligibility and funding applications electronically. It is anticipated that the first application will be the CTEFP and should be ready at the end of January 2018. OPSC will provide additional updates as they become available.

Seismic Mitigation Program Projects

There were four Seismic Mitigation Program projects in the Consent portion of the Agenda that received unfunded approvals in the amount of \$10.3 million.

Joint Agency Workshops

The OPSC, CDE and Division of the State Architect (DSA) continue to hold joint agency workshops. These workshops provide school districts and stakeholders with updates on the SFP, as well as CDE and DSA processes. Some sessions are specialized for small school districts to directly address concerns and seek assistance on specific projects or facility needs that may be eligible for funding. Sessions and handouts are posted on OPSC's website.

Next SAB Meeting

The SAB and stakeholders were informed that the next SAB meeting has been tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, January 24, 2018.

APPEAL ITEMS

Klamath-Trinity Joint Unified/Humboldt 51/62901-00-006, 010, 012, 013 and 014

The SAB approved the District request for: 1) replacement funding to perform rehabilitation work for Projects Number 51/62901-00-010, 12, 13 and 14, and 2) immediate Apportionments outside of Priorities in Funding for the five projects. The SAB also included in its approval to allow the District up to one year from the date of this approval (December 6, 2017) to finalize the eligible site development grants for the minimum work necessary for required dewatering systems, sewers, and storm drains to mitigate the identified health and safety threats for the projects (51/62901-00-010, 12, 13 and 14) as shown on Attachments C, D, E and F.

Maple Elementary/Kern 51/63610-00-002

The SAB approved the following: 1) the District's change of scope request; 2) the project with an unfunded approval and placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans); and 3) the request for additional time to request and receive an adjustment to the unfunded approval to add site development grants. In addition to this approval, the SAB added the following three additional stipulations:

- The District must provide staff with the final DSA-approved plans and specifications for the revisions, final plan approval from CDE, and an updated cost estimate for the project prior to release of funds.
- The District must provide progress updates to staff regarding the change of scope every six months after the SAB's approval, until the District submits the information identified in the preceding bullet above.
- This approval does not extend any applicable project deadlines in the SFP Regulations, such as priority funding, substantial progress, expenditure reporting, or project completion.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER STATEMENT State Allocation Board Meeting, January 24, 2018

RECENT PRIORITY FUNDING FILING ROUND CLOSED

The priority funding filing period closed on December 7, 2017. The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) received requests for 81 of 87 unique projects from 63 school districts for a total of \$185.3 million. The requests will be valid from January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018.

Requirements for Participation in Priority Funding

OPSC reminds school districts that the requirements for Participation in the Priority Funding Process are in effect under School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.90.3. There are two ways for a school district to not participate in the priority funding process as follows:

- Not submit a valid priority funding request in the 30-day filing period, or
- Submit a valid priority funding request but fail to submit a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) to request the release of funds after the Board approves an apportionment.

The second time that either of these occurs, the funding for the project will be rescinded without further action by the Board. For additional information, please refer to the <u>Procedures for School Facility Program Funding</u>.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION FACILITIES PROGRAM

At its August 2017 meeting, the Board established two CTEFP filing rounds. For the first of these two new rounds, California Department of Education (CDE) grant applications were due to CDE by November 29, 2017. CDE received over 300 applications. These applications must be submitted to OPSC for funding consideration by close of business on February 21, 2017. In addition; OPSC Staff collaborated with CDE to develop the schedule listed below for the fifth funding cycle of the CTEFP:

- CDE Grant Applications deadline is October 31, 2018.
- Grant Application scores published by CDE February 2019.
- Application for *Career Technical Education Facility Funding* (Form SAB 50-10) due to OPSC by close of business February 15, 2019.
- Presentation to the Board by June 2019.

The CDE is in the process of making minor revisions to their CTE Grant Application. We will share those updates with districts in the upcoming weeks.

ONLINE FUNDING APPLICATIONS

OPSC is developing new on-line options for the School Facility Program applications. The long-term plan is to provide school districts the ability to submit eligibility and funding applications electronically. We are looking forward to having the first application ready at the end of January, which will be the Career Technical Education Facilities Program Funding (CTEFP) Application. Additional updates will be provided in the future.

JOINT AGENCY WORKSHOPS

The Office of Public School Construction, the California Department of Education, and the Division of the State Architect are continuing to hold joint agency workshops in 2018. These workshops will provide school districts and stakeholders with updates regarding the impact of Proposition 51 on the SFP along with other general information and changes to the program. There will also be additional sessions for small school districts to directly address concerns and provide assistance on specific projects or facility needs that may be eligible for funding.

The next joint agency workshops are scheduled as follows:

January 30, 2018 at the Stanislaus County Office of Education in Modesto February 9, 2018 at Brentwood Union School District Offices in Brentwood

NEXT STATE ALLOCATION BOARD MEETING

The next meeting is scheduled for February 28, 2018.

State of California State Allocation Board School Facility Program

This Resolution of the State Allocation Board (hereafter referred to as the "Board") is applicable to the appropriate sections of the Education Code and is described and filed in the office of the Executive Officer and will be made available to all interested parties as the Resolution pertains to the documents attached hereto. Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on January 24, 2018.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
- 2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
- 3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3rd Street, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
- 5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT TO SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM GRANTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To adopt the annual adjustment in the School Facility Program (SFP) grants based on the change in construction costs pursuant to the Education Code (EC) and SFP Regulations.

DESCRIPTION

This item presents the State Allocation Board (Board) with the annual adjustment to the SFP grants based on the statewide cost index for Class B construction. Each year the Board adjusts the SFP grants to reflect construction cost changes. In January 2016, the Board adopted the RS Means index for 2016 and future years. This item presents the 2018 annual adjustment to SFP grants based on the RS Means index.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

See Attachment A.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

At the January 2016 meeting, the Board adopted an increase to the SFP grants using the RS Means Construction Cost Index (CCI) as the statewide cost index for Class B construction.

The current rate of change between 2017 and 2018 for the RS Means Class B CCl is 4.17 percent. The chart below reflects the amounts previously adopted for 2017 compared to the potential amount for the new construction base grants.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the increase of 4.17 percent for the 2018 SFP grants based on the RS Means Construction Cost Index as shown in Attachment B.

For the New Construction grant, EC Section 17072.10(b) states, "The board annually shall adjust the per-unhousedpupil apportionment to reflect construction cost changes, as set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction as determined by the board."

For Modernization funding, EC Section 17074.10(b) states, "The board shall annually adjust the factors set forth in subdivision (a) according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction, as determined by the board."

Government Code Section 66452.6 states:

(a)(1) An approved or conditionally approved tentative map shall expire 24 months after its approval or conditional approval, or after any additional period of time as may be prescribed by local ordinance, not to exceed an additional 12 months. However, if the subdivider is required to expend two hundred thirty-six thousand seven hundred ninety dollars (\$236,790) or more to construct, improve, or finance the construction or improvement of public improvements outside the property boundaries of the tentative map, excluding improvements of public rights-of-way which abut the boundary of the property to be subdivided and which are reasonably related to the development of that property, each filing of a final map authorized by Section 66456.1 shall extend the expiration of the approved or conditionally approved tentative map by 36 months from the date of its expiration, as provided in this section, or the date of the previously filed final map, whichever is later. The extensions shall not extend the tentative map more than 10 years from its approval or conditional approval....

(2) Commencing January 1, 2012, and each calendar year thereafter, the amount of two hundred thirty-six thousand seven hundred ninety dollars (\$236,790) shall be annually increased by operation of law according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction, as determined by the State Allocation Board at its January meeting. The effective date of each annual adjustment shall be March 1. The adjusted amount shall apply to tentative and vesting tentative maps whose applications were received after the effective date of the adjustment.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.71 states,

The new construction per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17072.10(a), will be adjusted annually based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January. The base Class B Construction Cost Index shall be 1.30 and the first adjustment shall be January, 1999.

The new construction per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17072.10(a), may be increased by an additional amount not to exceed six percent in a fiscal year, or decreased, based on the analysis of the current cost to build schools as reported on the Project Information Worksheet (Revised 05/10) which shall be submitted with the Forms SAB 50-05 and 50-06 and as approved by the Board.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 Definitions states, "Class B Construction Cost Index" is a construction factor index for structures made of reinforced concrete or steel frames, concrete floors, and roofs, and accepted and used by the Board.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.78 states, "The modernization per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17074.10(a), will be adjusted annually based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January."

INDEX ADJUSTMENT ON THE ASSESSMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To report the index adjustment on the assessment for development, which may be levied pursuant to Education Code Section 17620.

DESCRIPTION

The law requires the maximum assessment for development be adjusted every two years by the change in the Class B construction cost index, as determined by the State Allocation Board (Board) at its January meeting. This item requests that the Board make the adjustment based on the change reflected using the RS Means index.

AUTHORITY

Education Code Section 17620(a)(1) states the following: "The governing board of any school district is authorized to levy a fee, charge, dedication, or other requirement against any construction within the boundaries of the district, for the purpose of funding the construction or reconstruction of school facilities, subject to any limitations set forth in Chapter 4.9 (commencing with Section 65995) of Division 1 of Title 7 of the Government Code."

Government Code Section 65995(b)(3) states the following: "The amount of the limits set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) shall be increased in 2000, and every two years thereafter, according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction, as determined by the State Allocation Board at its January meeting, which increase shall be effective as of the date of that meeting."

BACKGROUND

There are three levels that may be levied for developer's fees. The fees are levied on a per-square foot basis. The lowest fee, Level I, is assessed if the district conducts a Justification Study that establishes the connection between the development coming into the district and the assessment of fees to pay for the cost of the facilities needed to house future students. The Level II fee is assessed if a district makes a timely application to the Board for new construction funding, conducts a School Facility Needs Analysis pursuant to Government Code Section 65995.6, and satisfies at least two of the requirements listed in Government Code Section 65995.5(b)(3). The Level III fee is assessed when State bond funds are exhausted; the district may impose a developer's fee up to 100 percent of the School Facility Program new construction project cost.

A historical comparison of the assessment rates for development fees for 2014 and 2016 are shown below for information. According to the RS Means, the cost index for Class B construction increased by 8.78, during the two year period from January 2016 to January 2018, requiring the assessment for development fees to be adjusted as follows beginning January 2018:

Non-Conforming Buildings (Continued Use)

EXEMPTION FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY FACILITIES

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the Los Banos Unified School District's (District) request, as shown on the Attachment, for an exemption from the definition of "school buildings" for certain facilities used for independent study.

DESCRIPTION

The District operates an independent study program at facilities that are not located at a regular school site and is requesting an exemption from the definition of "school building," as described in Education Code (EC) Section 17283, for the facility.

EC Section 17289 authorizes any school district or county office of education to request an exemption from the State Allocation Board (Board) for a building or structure or portion of a building or structure used for independent study from the definition of "school buildings." These buildings do not have to meet the Field Act requirements but must comply with local health and safety standards.

The District has certified that it has satisfied the legal requirements under EC Section 17289 for the exemption.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

EC Section 17283 states: "School building" as used in this article means and includes any building used, or designed to be used, for elementary or secondary school purposes and constructed, reconstructed, altered, or added to, by the state or any city or city and county, or by any political subdivision or by any school district of any kind within the state, or by any regional occupational center or program created by or authorized to act by an agreement under joint exercise of power, or by the United States government, or any agency thereof."

EC Section 17289 states "In order to provide alternative, community-based educational opportunities through independent study, any school district or county office of education may request an exemption from the State Allocation Board for a building or structure, or portion of a building or structure, from the definition of "school buildings" within the meaning of Section 17283. The exemptions may be granted for no longer than two years and exemptions are renewable. An exemption may only be granted if the school district or county office of education demonstrates to the satisfaction of the State Allocation Board all of the following:

- (a) The building or structure, or portion of building or structure, satisfies all of the following:
- (1) It is not located on a regular schoolsite.
- (2) It complies with all applicable local building standards and all relevant local health and safety standards in the community in which it is located.
- (3) It is used for independent study.
- (4) It serves fewer than 25 pupils enrolled in kindergarten or any of the grades 1 to 12, inclusive, at any one time in the building or structure, or in a portion of a building or structure where the remainder of the building or structure is not used for instructional purposes.
- (b) The use of the building or structure is critical to providing an effective alternative, community-based program.
- (c) The use of other buildings or structures that would meet seismic safety standards for school facilities is not practical."

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

The District has provided certification that it has met the criteria as stated in EC Section 17289. An exemption has been requested for two years.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the District's request for an exemption from the definition of "school buildings" for the site listed on the Attachment from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019.

EXEMPTION FOR INDEPENDENT STUDY FACILITIES

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To correct the William S. Hart Union High School District's (District) request, as shown on the Attachment, for an exemption from the definition of "school buildings" for certain facilities used for independent study.

DESCRIPTION

The District operates an independent study program at a facility that is not located at a regular school site and is requesting an exemption from the definition of "school building," as described in Education Code (EC) Section 17283, for the facility.

EC Section 17289 authorizes any school district or county office of education to request an exemption from the State Allocation Board (Board) for a building or structure or portion of a building or structure used for independent study from the definition of "school buildings." These buildings do not have to meet the Field Act requirements but must comply with local health and safety standards.

The District has certified that it has satisfied the legal requirements under EC Section 17289 for the exemption.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

EC Section 17283 states: "School building" as used in this article means and includes any building used, or designed to be used, for elementary or secondary school purposes and constructed, reconstructed, altered, or added to, by the state or any city or city and county, or by any political subdivision or by any school district of any kind within the state, or by any regional occupational center or program created by or authorized to act by an agreement under joint exercise of power, or by the United States government, or any agency thereof."

EC Section 17289 states "In order to provide alternative, community-based educational opportunities through independent study, any school district or county office of education may request an exemption from the State Allocation Board for a building or structure, or portion of a building or structure, from the definition of "school buildings" within the meaning of Section 17283. The exemptions may be granted for no longer than two years and exemptions are renewable. An exemption may only be granted if the school district or county office of education demonstrates to the satisfaction of the State Allocation Board all of the following:

- (a) The building or structure, or portion of building or structure, satisfies all of the following:
- (1) It is not located on a regular schoolsite.
- (2) It complies with all applicable local building standards and all relevant local health and safety standards in the community in which it is located.
- (3) It is used for independent study.
- (4) It serves fewer than 25 pupils enrolled in kindergarten or any of the grades 1 to 12, inclusive, at any one time in the building or structure, or in a portion of a building or structure where the remainder of the building or structure is not used for instructional purposes.
- (b) The use of the building or structure is critical to providing an effective alternative, community-based program.
- (c) The use of other buildings or structures that would meet seismic safety standards for school facilities is not practical."

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

The District has provided certification that it has met the criteria as stated in EC Section 17289. At the December 2017 Board meeting Staff incorrectly stated that the District reported an exemption for one year. An exemption has been requested for two years. This Item is to correct the request.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the District's request for an exemption from the definition of "school buildings" for the site listed on the Attachment from January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019.

EMERGENCY REPAIR PROGRAM GRANT ADJUSTMENTS - SAVINGS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To reduce grant apportionments for Emergency Repair Program (ERP) projects.

DESCRIPTION

The Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) listed on the Attachment have submitted the required *Expenditure Reports* (Form SAB 61-04) that indicate expenditures are less than the ERP funded grant (savings). In addition, any interest earned on the reported savings has been verified.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 2, Section 1859.330, states in part, that when expenditures have been determined to be less than the ERP funded grant, the apportionment for ERP funding should be reduced (adjusted) by the amount of the savings and any interest earned.

CCR Title 2, Section 1859.324.1(a), states in part, that when adjustments to apportionments are established, collection procedures must be initiated.

RECOMMENDATION

Reduce the grant apportionments by the savings and interest earned for the ERP applications listed on Attachment.

EMERGENCY REPAIR PROGRAM FUNDING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present Emergency Repair Program (ERP) funding applications for Apportionment.

DESCRIPTION

As of December 6, 2017, the State Allocation Board (Board) has apportioned \$797.7 million for funded projects. The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has received savings from previously funded projects. This item recommends the Board to approve Apportionments for the next applications in line.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

ERP Regulation Section 1859.322. Emergency Repair Program Project Funding Order.

The Board shall make apportionments on a monthly basis for Grants in the order of receipt of an Accepted Application and for Grant Adjustments in the order of receipt of a complete Form SAB 61-04, as follows:

(a) If sufficient funding is available to provide funding to all applications presented that month, all applications will receive an Apportionment of the eligible costs.

(b) If funding is insufficient in any given month:

 (1) Grants will be provided to each application on a prorated basis with the balance placed on the Unfunded List, unless the proration will result in funding less than 25 percent of the eligible project costs. The proration shall be determined by dividing the total funds available by the total eligible costs of all applications Ready for Apportionment. All Grant Adjustments will be placed on the Unfunded List.
(2) If the proration, as determined in (1) above, will be less than 25 percent of the eligible project costs, the Board shall provide Grant funding at 100 percent of the eligible project costs of the Grants based on date order received until funds are no longer available and the remaining Grant applications shall be placed on the Unfunded List. All Grant Adjustments will be placed on the Unfunded List.
(3) The Board will continue to accept and process applications for the purpose of developing an Unfunded List based on the order of receipt of the Accepted Applications.

When funds become available, projects on the Unfunded List will be apportioned in the order of date received. From available funds, Grants will be funded first and Grant Adjustments will be funded second. After an Apportionment has been made by the Board, funds will be released automatically by the OPSC. If local funds have been expended, the Apportionment must be used by the LEA [Local Educational Agency] to reimburse the special reserve fund and the original source of funds used to make the LEA expenditures for the ERP project.

Once all ERP funds have been depleted, any applications that have received a prorated Apportionment, a Grant, or a Grant Adjustment will be deemed a full and final Apportionment, any applications remaining fully unfunded on the Unfunded List will be returned to the LEA, and the Unfunded List shall be dissolved.

STAFF ANALYSIS / ATTACHMENT

ERP Regulation Section 1859.322 requires the Board to make apportionments on a monthly basis and provides for an unfunded list to be generated when there is insufficient funding in any given month. ERP Regulation Section 1859.322(b) further requires that if funding is insufficient in any given month Grants will be provided to each application on a prorated basis, unless the proration will result in funding less than 25 percent of the eligible project costs, with the balance placed on an Unfunded List. ERP Regulations further stipulate that when funds become available, projects on the Unfunded List, which includes applications that have been funded with prorated amounts, will be apportioned funds in the order of date received.

RECOMMENDATION

Apportion \$1,080,518 in ERP funds for six applications listed on the Attachment from Fund 3082-000.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(a) states:

A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states, "A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to replace or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils."

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1) provides for Facility Hardship grant funding when:

The facilities are needed to ensure the health and safety of the pupils if the district can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the health and safety of the pupils is at risk. Factors to be considered by the Board shall include the close proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission lines, dam, pipeline, industrial facility, adverse air quality emission or other health and safety risks, including structural deficiencies required by the DSA to be repaired, seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as verified by the DSA, traffic safety or because the pupils reside in remote areas of the district and transportation to existing facilities is not possible or poses a health and safety risk.

SFP Regulation Section (a)(1)(C) states,

The seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:

- 1. The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;
- 2. The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval;
- 3. The building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and

4. The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. If the unacceptable risk of injury is due to the presence of faulting, liquefaction or landslide, these hazards must be documented by a geologic hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance with California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with the concurrence of the California Geological Survey.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1)(A)(1) states,

If the total cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is 50 percent or less than the Current Replacement Cost, the district may qualify for either grant below, as applicable:

a. Modernization Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for Rehabilitation Costs pursuant to Section 1859.83(e), or

b. A grant not to exceed 50 percent of the cost estimate that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the Board for seismic repair.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1)(D) states, "Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding."

The below map illustrates the regional distribution of \$943.9 million in Overcrowding Relief Grant school facility funding awarded by the State Allocation Board from 1998 to December 31, 2017. The map also shows the regional distribution of projects.

CHARTER SCHOOL FACILITIES PROGRAM PRELIMINARY CHARTER SCHOOL APPORTIONMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To provide 25 Preliminary Charter School Apportionments for the Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) in the amount of \$243,013,928.

DESCRIPTION

Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 (Proposition 51) provides \$500 million for the CSFP. This program provides qualified applicants with a preliminary apportionment for the construction of new charter schools or the rehabilitation of existing district-owned facilities that are at least 15 years old.

The applications that are included on Attachment B underwent a thorough review process by both the California School Finance Authority (CSFA) and the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC). The applicants have been determined to be financially sound and all program requirements have been met. This item seeks Board approval of the Preliminary Charter School Apportionments shown on Attachment B.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

In 2002, Assembly Bill 14 created the CSFP. Through the passage of the Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Acts of 2002 (Proposition 47), 2004 (Proposition 55) and 2006 (Proposition 1D), \$900 million has been made available for the new construction of charter school facilities or the rehabilitation of existing school district facilities for charter school use. Proposition 51 made an additional \$500 million available for the CSFP. This program allows charter schools that provide site based instruction to access State facility funding directly or through the school district where the project will be physically located.

The CSFP permits a charter school, or school district filing on behalf of a charter school (applicant), to apply for a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment for new construction projects and rehabilitation of existing district-owned facilities that are at least 15 years old. To qualify for funding, a charter school must be deemed financially sound by CSFA.

If the estimated total apportionment of all financially sound applicants exceeds the funds available the Board will provide Preliminary Charter School Apportionments based on both preference points and funding category using the following criteria per School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.164 to ensure that a variety of project types are funded.

BACKGROUND (cont.)

Preference points for applicants are calculated based on the following criteria:

- Percentage of overcrowding for the school district where the project will be located and the project's effort to relieve overcrowding;
- Percentage of low income pupils in the school district where the project will be located, any public school within the Charter School General Location, or the existing charter school;
- > Whether or not the entity operating the charter school is a non-profit entity, and
- > Whether or not the charter school is rehabilitating existing district-owned facilities.

Once the preference points have been established, the application with the highest number of points will be funded in each of the following categories pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.164:

(a) Geographical Region One, Two, Three, or Four

- (b) Urban, Rural or Suburban areas
- (c) Large, Medium, or Small Charter Schools
- (d) K-6, 7-8, or 9-12 grade levels.

The Preliminary Charter School Apportionment is a reservation of CSFP bond authority for the project. Successful applicants must obtain the necessary plan and site approvals and convert from preliminary to a Final Charter School Apportionment meeting all the SFP criteria within a four-year period, unless a one-time one-year extension is granted. Any Preliminary Charter School Apportionment not converted within the specified time period will be rescinded and the authority reserved for the project will be returned to the CSFP.

All applicants that have a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment may request an advance fund release for design costs. Applicants that reserved costs for site acquisition as part of their Preliminary Charter School Apportionment may also request an advance fund release to purchase a site. The amounts for site acquisition and design are calculated pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.164.2. Applicants must participate in the Priority Funding process to request these funds, as outlined in SFP Regulation Section 1859.90.2.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

As a result of the passage of Proposition 51, and pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation Section 1859.161, a filing round for the CSFP occurred from February 6, 2017 through June 5, 2017. The OPSC accepted 191 applications requesting approximately \$3.5 billion in funding by the filing deadline.

On Attachment B of this item, the first 25 applications eligible for funding are presented for Board approval. The applications have been fully processed and determined to be financially sound by CSFA. They are shown in rank order as required by SFP Regulation Section 1859.164, and are recommended for a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment.

OPSC anticipates bringing a subsequent item to the next available Board meeting to award additional Preliminary Charter School Apportionments up to the amount of available CSFP bond authority.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Approve Preliminary Charter School Apportionments for the projects shown on Attachment B in the amount of \$243,013,928. Applicants receiving a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment must convert the project to a Final Charter School Apportionment within four years from the date of this approval pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.166.
- 2. Place the separate advance fund release amounts for design and site, as applicable, for each Preliminary Charter School Apportionment on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans).

This Item was approved by the State Allocation Board on January 24, 2018.

ATTACHMENT A

AUTHORITY

Education Code (EC) Section 17078.52(a) There is hereby established the Charter Schools Facilities Program to provide funding to qualifying entities for the purpose of establishing school facilities for charter school pupils.

EC Section 17078.52(c)(3) "Preliminary apportionment" means an apportionment made for eligible applicants under this article in advance of full compliance with all of the application requirements otherwise required for an apportionment pursuant to this chapter. The process for making preliminary apportionments under this article shall be substantially identical to the process established for critically overcrowded schools pursuant to Section 17078.22 to 17078.30, inclusive.

Education Code Section 101122(a)(2) states that "The amount of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) shall be available for providing school facilities to charter schools pursuant to Article 12 (commencing with Section 17078.52) of Chapter 12.5 of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1."

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.2 "Final Charter School Apportionment" shall mean a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment that has been converted to a Final Charter School Apportionment in accordance with 1859.165.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 "Preliminary Charter School Apportionment" means an apportionment made pursuant to Education Code Section 17078.52(c)(3).

SFP Regulation Section 1859.161. Preliminary Charter School Application Submittals. An applicant seeking a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall complete and submit Form SAB 50-09 between February 2003 and March 31, 2003, or during a period of 120 calendar days beginning 90 calendar days after an election authorizing additional funding.

The Board may establish additional application filing periods as needed.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.164. Application Funding Criteria.

If the estimated total apportionments of all Financially Sound Preliminary Charter School Applications received in either filing period specified in Section 1859.161 exceed the funds available, the applications shall be identified in each of the following four categories:

(a) Geographical Region One, Two, Three, or Four.

- (b) Urban, Rural, or Suburban areas.
- (c) Large, Medium, or Small Charter Schools.
- (d) K-6, 7-8, or 9-12 grade levels.

The Board shall first apportion one project of each possible type, a maximum of four in category (a) and a maximum of three in categories (b) through (d), starting with (a) and continuing through (d). If more than one application is received of the same type within a category, the Board will apportion based on which project has the highest preference points, calculated in Section 1859.164.1. If a project has the highest preference points but was previously apportioned, the project with the next highest preference points will be apportioned. The same process will continue for the remaining categories until the Board has apportioned a project within each type in categories (a) through (d), or until no funding remains. If after funding one project in each category (a) through (d), funding remains available, the process shall be repeated until no funding remains.

Section 1859.164.1. Calculation of Preference Points.

Preference points will be calculated for all Preliminary Charter School Applications. An application shall receive preference points based on the total of (a), (b), (c) and (d), up to a maximum of 160 points, as follows:

(a) Low Income: Up to 40 points based on the percentage of pupils at either the Charter School or school district where the Charter School is or will be located, or any public school within the Charter School General Location

meeting the definition of Low-income. The Charter School may report the highest percentage of the three. Use the following sliding scale to determine the number of preference points:

16-30%	8

48-55%	20
56-64%	24
65-73%	28

(b) Overcrowded School District: Up to 40 points if the school district where the Charter School is physically located is determined to be overcrowded by dividing the remaining New Construction Eligibility (prior to the reduction from this application) by the district's current enrollment and multiplying the product by 100. The following sliding scale determines the maximum number of preference points available for the degree of overcrowding:

Percentage Overcrowded	Preference Points Assigned
2-9%	4
10-13%	8
14-16%	12
17-19%	16
20-22%	20
23-25%	24
26-33%	28
34-41%	32
42-49%	36
50% and above 40	40

The method of allocating preference points to applicants will utilize the percentage overcrowded chart for a maximum point distribution. Next, each application will be assigned an "effort" percentage which further allocates points within each

overcrowding point category. The percentage generated by the number of unhoused pupils that the project will house, divided by the project capacity will represent the effort made to relieve overcrowding in the district. The "effort" percentage will be assigned the following point distribution:

% Effort to Relieve Overcrowding	Ratio of Overcrowded Points Awarded
40% or more	100% of the points for the overcrowded category
30-39%	90% of the points for the overcrowded category
20-29%	80% of the points for the overcrowded category
10-19%	70% of the points for the overcrowded category
1-9%	60% of the points for the overcrowded category
0	No points for the overcrowded category

The total points assigned for overcrowding will be calculated by applying the appropriate "effort" percentage and its corresponding ratio of points to the percentage overcrowded category for the district in which the project will be physically located.

(c) Non-Profit Entity: If the entity operating the Charter School meets the definition of a Non-Profit Entity, the project will receive 40 preference points.

(d) Existing Facilities: If the project proposes to rehabilitate existing facilities, the project will receive 40 preference points.

Section 1859.164.2. Preliminary Charter School Apportionment Fund Release.

An applicant receiving a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment from the Board after July 2, 2003 may request an advance release of funds for either of the following:

(a) A separate advance release of funds for design equal to 20 percent of the amount determined in Section 1859.163.1(a)(1) through (8) and Section 1859.163.1(c)(1) and (2) or Section 1859.163.5(a)(1) through (6) and Section 1859.163.5(b)(1) and (2).

(b) A separate advance release of funds for site acquisition once the requirements in Section 1859.81.1(a)(2) and (3) are met for an amount not to exceed the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment for site acquisition. The Board shall release to the applicant an amount up to the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment determined in Section 1859.163.1(b).

Qualified applicants may request a separate advance release of funds for the design and for the site acquisition for the same project. An applicant seeking an advance release of funds pursuant to (a) and/or (b) must have been deemed and maintained financial soundness status from the Authority. Subject to the availability of financing provided by the Pooled Money Investment Board for bond-funded projects, the OPSC will release State funds included in a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment pursuant to (a) or (b) to the applicant after submittal of the Form SAB 50-05. The OPSC shall not release funds in excess of the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment. State funds released from a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment pursuant to this Section shall be subject to the provisions in Section 1859.166. Once the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment is converted to a Final Charter School Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.167, the applicant may request a release of the remaining funds as prescribed in Section 1859.90 or 1859.90.2. Prior to the release of any funds, the Charter School Agreements must be executed.

Section 1859.165. Conversion of Preliminary Charter School Apportionment.

When a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment is converted to a Final Charter School Apportionment, all the following criteria must be met:

(a) The Final Charter School Apportionment request must meet all criteria on the Form SAB 50-04.

(b) An applicant seeking to convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment to a Final Charter School Apportionment shall complete and file Form SAB 50-04. The number of pupils being requested cannot exceed the amount the applicant originally requested and received at the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment. If the applicant is unable to meet the criteria in this Section, the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded pursuant to the provisions of Section 1859.166.

Section 1859.166. Time Limit on Preliminary Charter School Apportionment.

(a) A complete request to convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment to a Final Charter School Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.165 shall be made within four years of the date of the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment unless the applicant received approval of an extension pursuant to Section 1859.166.1.
(b) If (a) is not met, and the applicant has not received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:

(1) the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the applicant, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;

(2) the SFP New Construction Eligibility will be increased by the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 for the school district that physically contains the Charter School within its geographical boundaries.(c) If (a) is not met, and the applicant has received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:

(1) The Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the applicant, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;

(2) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(a) shall be reduced to cost incurred and closed-out pursuant to Section 1859.106 with a corresponding SFP new construction baseline eligibility adjustment for the pupils assigned to the Preliminary Charter School Application. The adjustment to the baseline eligibility shall be based on the ratio of the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 and the project capacity which generated the project funding to the eligible expenditures. Any funds released are subject to the fifty percent local matching share requirement as required by EC 17078.54(d). Funds returned pursuant to Section 1859.106 shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;

(3) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(b) shall be subject to the provisions of Section 1859.171.

Section 1859.166.1. Preliminary Charter School Apportionment Time Limit Extension.

An applicant that has received a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment may request a single one-year extension of the time limit prescribed in Section 1859.166(a). The Board shall approve the request provided the criteria in (a) or (b) are met:

(a) The applicant has provided evidence of both of the following:

(1) The CDE has made a contingent or final approval of the proposed site; and,

(2) The DSA has confirmed that the final plans for the project have been submitted to the DSA for review and approval.

(b) Other evidence satisfactory to the Board justifying the extension.

SEISMIC MITIGATION PROGRAM AND OTHER TECHNICAL CONFORMING REGULATORY AMENDMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the State Allocation Board (Board) with the following:

- Proposed regulatory amendments to determine how to proceed with funding applications for Seismic Mitigation Program (SMP) projects now that bond funds specifically reserved for that purpose have been exhausted;
- 2. Technical regulatory amendments as a result of the Board's past action related to new construction application processing.

DESCRIPTION

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulations currently limit the available funding for SMP projects to \$199.5 million. As of January 1, 2018, the estimated value of SMP funding applications received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) exceeds the remaining funding. Staff has prepared proposed regulatory amendments for the Board's consideration that will allow SMP projects to be funded from the Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 (Proposition 51) new construction bond authority. Additionally, proposed regulatory amendments make technical, conforming changes to the processing of SFP New Construction eligibility determinations that are consistent with the Board's June 5, 2017 action.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

BACKGROUND

Seismic Mitigation Program Amendments

In establishing the SFP, the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 included a provision for districts to apply for facility hardship funding. Facility hardship projects include the repair, replacement, and construction of "new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils" (SFP Regulation Section 1859.82).

The Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2006 (Proposition 1D) expanded the circumstances in which a district can apply for facility hardship assistance to include "the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities ... determined by the department [of General Services] to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event" (Education Code Section 17075.10(a)). Proposition 1D limited funding of these seismic projects to "up to 10.5 percent" of new construction bond authority (\$1.9 billion). The Board approved regulations at its September 26, 2007 meeting establishing that the total available SMP funding is \$199.5 million, the maximum allowed. Statute passed in conjunction with Proposition 1D also requires that SMP funds "shall be allocated by the board on a 50-percent state share basis...." Therefore, whether the SMP work is made up of replacing facilities or rehabilitating facilities, the SMP funding must be allocated on a 50-percent-state-grant/50-percent-district-matching-share basis.

BACKGROUND (cont.)

Technical Conforming Amendments

At its June 5, 2017 meeting, the Board took action to address the funding applications on the Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List and all future funding applications. The Board decided that districts requesting new construction funding are required to submit new construction eligibility updates for the enrollment year in which the application is processed by OPSC.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

Seismic Mitigation Program Amendments

At this time, OPSC has received applications for SMP funding that exceed the available bond authority from Proposition 1D. In reviewing the funding allocations in Proposition 51, Staff believes that, with regulatory amendments, the Board has the option to fund SMP projects from Proposition 51. If the Board wishes to fund SMP projects as standard facility hardship projects, the proposed regulations would be necessary. The proposed amendments specify a funding source and address the differences between how Propositions 1D and 51 fund the School Facility Program.

SMP Funding Must Come from New Construction

The proposed regulatory amendments provide for SMP project funding from new construction bond authority, as is consistent with the provisions of current and past propositions and existing statute. Proposition 51 language was sufficiently broad in that no limitation on funding SMP projects or other Facility Hardship projects exists in the new construction bond authority section. Staff believes SMP projects can be funded with new construction bond authority because the SMP's statutory framework is Article 8 (commencing with Section 17075.10) which is within Chapter 12.5. Specifically, Education Code (EC) Section 101122(a) (1) provides funds for "new construction of school facilities of applicant school districts pursuant to Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1." Legal counsel concurs with Staff's interpretation of this statute.

While the EC section for modernization is broad like new construction, Staff believes that the modernization bond authority cannot be used to fund SMP projects due to other statutory limitations. SMP projects must be funded on a 50/50 basis, pursuant to EC section 17075.10, whereas modernization projects must be funded on a 60/40 basis, pursuant to EC section 17074.16. Therefore, funding a SMP project with modernization funds on a 60/40 basis would violate SMP statute and funding it on a 50/50 basis would violate modernization statute.

Staff believes that funds made available for charter schools and career technical education facilities cannot be used to fund SMP projects. Proposition 51 limits the use of that authority to those programs. Specifically, EC Section 101122(a)(2) limits \$500 million to "school facilities to charter schools pursuant to Article 12 (commencing with Section 17078.52) of Chapter 12.5" and Education Code Section 101122(a)(4) limits \$500 million to "facilities for career technical education programs pursuant to Article 13 (commencing with Section 17078.70 of Chapter 12.5...." Staff believes SMP projects cannot be funded with charter or career technical education bond authority because the SMP's statutory framework is Article 8 (commencing with Section 17075.10) of Chapter 12.5 and is not referenced in either Article 12 or Article 13.

SMP and other Facility Hardship Project Types

While seismic mitigation work was added to the types of work eligible for facility hardship funding by Proposition 1D (EC Section 17075.10), some current regulations differentiate SMP from other Facility Hardship applications because Proposition 1D provided SMP with separate bond authority with a specified limit. The funding available to the two types of projects was distinct, which led to distinct funding application review processes.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

Proposition 51 did not make a distinction between the funding for SMP projects and the funding for other Facility Hardship projects. Both types of projects may be funded using new construction bond authority. The intent of the regulatory amendments is that SMP projects be funded like other Facility Hardship projects because both types of projects are eligible for funding from the same bond authority. For example, regulation sections that detail application processing that are specific to SMP applications will be removed and those sections that detail application processing for other Facility Hardship applications will be amended to include SMP projects. Additionally, regulation sections detailing SMP review processes in the event that funding becomes insufficient will be removed so that existing sections that apply to other Facility Hardship projects can apply to SMP projects, too.

Need for Regulatory Amendments

At this time, the estimated value of SMP funding applications received by OPSC that have not been processed or presented for Board approval exceeds the remaining funding made available by Proposition 1D. Four districts have submitted six SMP funding applications. The six applications request a total of approximately \$17 million in state SMP funds.

If the regulatory amendments provided in Attachment B are not approved by the Board, then Staff will offer the remaining funding to the district whose application was received first, pursuant to SFP Regulation 1859.82(a)(1)(E). Staff will also return the remaining five SMP funding applications to the districts pursuant to the same section.

In the table below, the district above the bold line would be offered the remaining available funding. The funding applications listed below the bold line would be returned to the districts.

Additional SMP funding applications have been received by OPSC that would also be included below the bold line but are not included in the chart above because Staff is still working with those applicant districts to ensure the funding applications are complete.

Summary of SMP Regulatory Amendments

A summary of the amendments is provided below. The full text of the amendments is included as Attachment B.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 – Definitions

The amendments:

- Revise the definition of "SFP New Construction Account" to include Propositions 1A (1998), 1D (2006), and 51 (2016) and
- Correct a reference in the definition of "Seismic Rehabilitation Grant."
STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 - Facility Hardship

The amendments:

- Replace the \$199.5 million authority limit with language that SMP projects be funded only from new construction bond authority,
- Remove SMP project funding order provisions that will be unnecessary when approved with amendments to SFP Regulation Section 1859.93.1, as described below,
- Remove SMP project funding provisions which detail funding an SMP project when insufficient funding is available, and
- Remove the provision that SMP funding applications not apportioned or approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) be returned to the applicant.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.93.1 – New Construction Project Funding Order

The amendment removes an exemption that differentiated SMP projects from other Facility Hardship projects so that SMP projects and other Facility Hardship projects will be funded at the same priority level.

Technical Conforming Amendments

Staff is presenting technical, conforming regulatory amendments (SFP Regulation Sections 1859.51(e) and 1859.70) based on the Board's June 5, 2017 action. That action requires districts to update their new construction eligibility when OPSC begins processing the districts' new construction funding application. The regulatory amendments also allow Small School Districts to submit new construction eligibility updates earlier than when it is requested by OPSC, so that Small School Districts may secure their eligibility for up to three subsequent enrollment reporting years (SFP Regulation Section 1859.51(j)), as is intended by statute.

The regulatory amendments also require that districts submit an *Enrollment Certification/Projection* (Form SAB 50-01) within 90 days of OPSC notification that it will begin processing the districts' *Application For Funding* (Form SAB 50-04). Failure to submit the requested documents within the 90-day time frame may result in a return of the districts' Form SAB 50-04.

Summary

Staff is presenting the attached regulatory amendments for approval on an emergency basis so that the SMP funding applications recently received by Staff can be processed for approval at the earliest possible Board meeting and so that funding is available for those health and safety projects at that time. Approving the regulation amendments for Facility Hardship will enable Staff to process the five remaining SMP projects as facility hardship projects using new construction funds.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Adopt the regulatory amendments as shown in Attachment B.
- 2. Authorize the Executive Officer to file the regulatory amendments with the Office of Administrative Law on an emergency basis.

This Item was approved by the State Allocation Board on January 24, 2018.

ATTACHMENT A

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10 states:

(a) A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

(b) A school district applying for hardship state funding under this article shall comply with either paragraph (1) or (2).

(1) Demonstrate both of the following:

(A) That due to extreme financial, disaster-related, or other hardship the school district has unmet need for pupil housing.

(B) That the school district is not financially capable of providing the matching funds otherwise required for state participation, that the district has made all reasonable efforts to impose all levels of local debt capacity and development fees, and that the school district is, therefore, unable to participate in the program pursuant to this chapter except as set forth in this article.

(2) Demonstrate that due to unusual circumstances that are beyond the control of the district, excessive costs need to be incurred in the construction of school facilities. Funds for the purpose of seismic mitigation work or facility replacement pursuant to this section shall be allocated by the board on a 50-percent state share basis from funds reserved for that purpose in any bond approved by the voters after January 1, 2006. If the board determines that the seismic mitigation work of a school building would require funding that is greater than 50 percent of the funds required to construct a new facility, the school district shall be eligible for funding to construct a new facility under this chapter.

(c) The board shall review the increased costs that may be uniquely associated with urban construction and shall adjust the per-pupil grant for new construction or modernization hardship applications as necessary to accommodate those costs. The board shall adopt regulations setting forth the standards, methodology, and a schedule of allowable adjustments, for the urban adjustment factor established pursuant to this subdivision.

EC Section 17072.30 states:

(a) Subject to the availability of funds, and to the determination of priority pursuant to Section 17072.25, if applicable, the board shall apportion funds to an eligible school district only upon the approval of the project by the Department of General Services pursuant to the Field Act, as defined in Section 17281, and certification by the school district that the required 50 percent matching funds from local sources have been expended by the district for the project, or have been deposited in the county fund, or will be expended by the district by the time the project is completed, in an amount at least equal to the proposed apportionment pursuant to this chapter, prior to release of the state funds.

(b) This section is operative January 1, 2008.

EC Section 17074.16 states:

(a) The board shall release disbursements to school districts with approved applications for modernization, to the extent state funds are available for the state's 60-percent share, and the school district has provided its 40-percent local match....

(b) This section shall apply only to an application that was filed after April 29, 2002.

EC Section 101122 states:

(a) The proceeds from the sale of bonds, issued and sold for the purposes of this chapter, shall be allocated in accordance with the following schedule:

(1) The amount of three billion dollars (\$3,000,000,000) for new construction of school facilities of applicant school districts pursuant to Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1.
 (2) The amount of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) shall be available for providing school facilities to charter schools pursuant to Article 12 (commencing with Section 17078.52) of Chapter 12.5 of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1.

(3) The amount of three billion dollars (\$3,000,000,000) for the modernization of school facilities pursuant to Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1.

(4) The amount of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) for facilities for career technical education programs pursuant to Article 13 (commencing with Section 17078.70) of Chapter 12.5 of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1.

. . .

EC Section 17070.35 states in part:

(a) In addition to all other powers and duties as are granted to the board by this chapter, other statutes, or the California Constitution, the board shall do all of the following:

(1) Adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, for the administration of this chapter...

EC Section 17071.75 states in part:

After a one-time initial report of existing school building capacity has been completed, the ongoing eligibility of a school district for new construction funding shall be determined by making all of the following calculations:

. . .

(g) For a school district with an enrollment of 2,500 or less, an adjustment in enrollment projections shall not result in a loss of ongoing eligibility to that school district for a period of three years from the date of the approval of eligibility by the board.

ATTACHMENT B

Section 1859.2. Definitions.

For the purpose of these regulations, the terms set forth below shall have the following meanings, subject to the provisions of the Act:

. . .

"Seismic Rehabilitation Grant" means a grant allowable under Education Code Section 17075.10(a) and (b)(2) and Section 1859.82(a)(1)(A)2(1)b, excluding additional grants.

"SFP New Construction Account" means the fund for new construction projects authorized by Education Code Sections <u>100420(a)(1)</u>, 100620(a)(1), and 100820(a)(1), 101012(a)(1), and 101122(a)(1).

Section 1859.82. Facility Hardship.

A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils. A facility hardship is available for:

(a) Repair of facilities, new classrooms and/or subsidiary facilities (corridors, toilets, kitchens and other nonclassroom space), or replacement facilities if either (1) or (2) are met:

(1) The facilities are needed to ensure the health and safety of the pupils if the district can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the health and safety of the pupils is at risk. Factors to be considered by the Board shall include the close proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission lines, dam, pipeline, industrial facility, adverse air quality emission or other health and safety risks, including structural deficiencies required by the DSA to be repaired, seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as verified by the DSA, traffic safety or because the pupils reside in remote areas of the district and transportation to existing facilities is not possible or poses a health and safety risk. The total available funding Funding for seismic mitigation related and ancillary costs for the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings is \$199.5 million shall only be provided from the SFP New Construction Account.

. . .

(D) Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding.

(E) If an Application for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings cannot be fully apportioned or approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) because insufficient funding is available, the applicant may accept the remaining funding amount or refuse funding entirely. If partial funding is accepted, the applicant will remain eligible for the additional amount of seismic funds, up to the initial funding request, if funds become available within the Seismic Mitigation Program authority amount of \$199.5 million. If funding is refused, the Board shall consider funding the next project eligible for funding pursuant to this Section.

For any Application for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings not apportioned or approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) pursuant to this Section, the application shall be returned to the applicant.

. . .

Section 1859.93.1. New Construction Project Funding Order.

Applications, except those identified in (c) through (e) below, shall be funded as follows:

(a) First, to applications for Facility Hardship pursuant to Section 1859.82, except those for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings, in order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding; then,

(b) If there are no applications pursuant to subsection (a), to applications for New Construction Grant(s) in order of receipt of an Approved Application for Funding.

(c) Approved Applications for New Construction Grant(s) funded with the proceeds of state bonds approved by the voters prior to January 1, 2002.

(d) Approved Applications for New Construction Grant(s) authorized by Education Code Sections 17078.10 through 17078.30.

(e) Approved Applications that utilize pupil eligibility derived from the Alternative Enrollment Projection method. These applications shall be funded in order of receipt once the OPSC and the DRU have approved the Alternative Enrollment Projection method or the Alternative Enrollment Projection annual update.

Note: Authority cited: Section 17070.35, Education Code.

Reference: Sections 17072.25, 17070.35, and 17075.15, Education Code.

Section 1859.51. Adjustments to the New Construction Baseline Eligibility.

The baseline eligibility for new construction determined on the Form SAB 50-03, will be adjusted as follows:

•••

(e) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in subsequent enrollment reporting years for all districts using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection, except decreases as provided in (j) below. For all funding requests received by OPSC on or after June 6, 2017, OPSC will notify the School District in writing that OPSC is scheduled to begin processing the School District's Form SAB 50-04 and that the School District shall submit the Form SAB 50-01 for the current enrollment year. OPSC may return the Form SAB 50-04 to the School District for failure to submit the Form SAB 50-01 within 90 calendar days of OPSC's notification. Forms SAB 50-01 filed on or after November 1 must include the current enrollment year.

(1) Utilizing a fifth-year projection.

(2) Utilizing a tenth-year projection.

···

(j) For Small School Districts:

(1) Decreased:(1) By by any reduction in projected enrollment that follows a three-year period after the district's eligibility was approved by the Board, and either (2) or (3), as applicable:-

(2) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in the 2016/2017 enrollment year using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection if the Form SAB 50-01 is received at OPSC by October 31, 2017.

(3) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in subsequent enrollment reporting years following 2016/17 using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection.

If the Small School District does not submit an adjustment under (2) or (3) prior to OPSC notification of its schedule to begin processing the School District's request for new construction funding that was received by OPSC on or after November 1, 2012, then the requirements of (e) shall apply.

Section 1859.70. General.

A district seeking New Construction or Modernization funding shall complete and file Form SAB 50-04, concurrently or after completing the applicable requirements in Sections 1859.20 and 1859.40. The Board shall only provide New Construction funding if the Approved Application was received by the OPSC prior to the date of Occupancy for any classrooms included in the construction contract. After the date of Occupancy of any classroom in the construction contract, a <u>School dDistrict</u> will be ineligible to seek New Construction funding and the classrooms will be reduced from the baseline eligibility pursuant to Section 1859.51(i) if not previously reduced.

A district affected by a reorganization election on or after November 4, 1998 may not file an application for New Construction funding after the notification of the reorganization election. until The School dDistrict must submit a new calculation of the district's baseline eligibility has been as determined on the Form SAB 50-03 upon written notification, or the district certifiescertify that the reorganization election will not result in a loss of eligibility for the project for which the School dDistrict is requesting new construction grants. For all requests for funding received by the OPSC on or after June 6, 2017, the OPSC will notify the School District in writing that OPSC is scheduled to begin processing the School District's Form SAB 50-04. The School District must submit a completed Form SAB 50-03 within 90 calendar days of OPSC's notification.

A <u>School dDistrict</u> that is newly created as a result of a reorganization election may file an application for funding after approval of the election has been made by the State Board of Education.

GENERAL INFORMATION

If this application is submitted when there is Insufficient Bond Authority, as defined in Regulation Section 1859.2, the School District must adopt and submit a school board resolution, pursuant to Regulation Section 1859.95.1. For information regarding remaining bond authority, contact the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) prior to submittal of this application.

Once the Board has determined or adjusted the district's eligibility for either new construction or modernization funding, the <u>If not previously submitted</u>, a district may file an application for <u>modernization</u> funding by use of this form <u>concurrently</u> with a determination of or an adjustment to the district's eligibility. The district must submit a determination of or an adjustment to the district's new construction baseline eligibility upon request, as described in Regulation Sections 1859.51 or 1859.70, as applicable. The Board will only provide new construction funding if this form is submitted prior to the date of occupancy of any classrooms included in the construction contract. If the district has a pending reorganization election that will result in the loss of eligibility for the proposed project, the district <u>must submit may not file an application for funding until the Board has adjusted an adjustment to</u> the district's new construction baseline eligibility as required in Section 1859.51 upon request. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To provide the State Allocation Board (Board) with an update on the passage of legislation in 2017 that may impact programs administered by the Board.

DESCRIPTION

Consistent with prior requests by the Board, Staff presents a report on the chaptered bills that may impact the programs administered by the Board at the end of each legislative year. The Attachment provides a summary of the chaptered bills and preliminary comments by Staff. It is not a comprehensive study of the bills' ramifications or program implications.

Assembly Bill (AB) 10 (Garcia) Chapter 687	 Feminine hygiene products: public school restrooms. Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

- (b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:
- (1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.
- (2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.
- (1) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).
- (2) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.
- (3) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.
- (4) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.
- (5) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

- (c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:
- (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.
- (2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).
- (3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.
- (4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.
- (5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when

relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

- (A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship status.
- (B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.
- (d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).
- (e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).
- (1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.
- (2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must re-qualify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.
- (3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

- (f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 Ioans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.
- (g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.
- (h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.
- (1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.
- (2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:
- a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.
- b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.
- (3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.
- (4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
