What is a Grant Agreement?

- A Grant Agreement is an agreement between the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) and an applicant who is approved by the State Allocation Board (SAB) to receive School Facility Program (SFP) funding and/or Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Program (FDK) funding.
- An agreement is required for each funding application.

History of Grant Agreement

- In August 2016, staff notified the Board of findings and recommendations of the 2016 audit of the administration of Proposition 1D bond funds by the Office of State Audits and Evaluations (OSAE).
- The audit findings included recommendations to improve accountability in the program.
- Staff responded to OSAE that the Board would consider addressing the findings and recommendations after the outcome of the November 2016 election. The passage of the Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 (Proposition 51) and the accountability measures proposed in the Governor's 2017-18 Budget prompted staff to explore possible regulatory and policy changes for the SFP.

History of Grant Agreement (Cont.)

- At its January 25, 2017 SAB meeting, the SAB directed staff to develop a grant agreement and conforming regulatory amendments.
- At the April 24, 2017 SAB meeting after input from stakeholders, staff presented an item to seek SAB approval for a template grant agreement and conforming regulatory amendments.
- At the June 5, 2017 SAB meeting, the SAB approved the Grant Agreement Template and accompanying regulatory amendments after additional input from stakeholders and updates by staff.
- At the October 24, 2018 SAB meeting, the SAB adopted the proposed FDK program Regulations, Forms, and Grant Agreement.

What is The Purpose of a Grant Agreement?

- Developed to improve oversight and accountability in the program.
- Serves as a binding document that defines the responsibility of districts and the state.
- Shows the determination of the amount of eligible state funding.
- Details how project funds must be reported, including savings.
- Useful tool for applicants to ensure they have a thorough understanding of the requirements in receiving State funding.
- Identifies common eligible or ineligible project expenditures in the SFP and FDK program (Appendix G "Advisory Listing Detailing Common Eligible Project Expenditures" and Appendix H "Advisory Listing Detailing Common Ineligible Project Expenditures").

Who is Required to Enter Into a Grant Agreement?

 All applicants who have an SFP or FDK project approved by the SAB/Board on or after June 5, 2017.



Who Can Sign a Grant Agreement & When Does it Need to be Submitted?

- Pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation Section 1859.90.4 and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Regulation Section 1860.17, an authorized District Representative must submit the Grant Agreement with signatures to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) prior to, or concurrently with, a *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) in order for the fund release request submittal to be considered complete.
- Signed Grant Agreements may be submitted once the project has received an unfunded approval; but a Form SAB 50-05 should not be submitted until the district is participating in an active Priority in Funding Round (PIF) and the State Allocation Board (SAB) awards the project an apportionment.

Grant Agreement and OPSC Online

- OPSC Online supports the submission of Grant Agreements.
- Preferred method of submission, as well as the simplest because it does not require the District to prepare or sign a letter.
- District Representative or Superintendent must be logged in to submit the request.
- The project must be in SAB Approved status in OPSC Online.

Pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation Section 1859.90.4, an authorized District Representative must submit the Grant Agreement with signatures to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) prior to, or concurrently with, a *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) in order for the fund release request submittal to be considered complete. Signed Grant Agreements may be submitted once the project has received an unfunded approval; but a Form SAB 50-05 should not be submitted until the district is participating in an active Priority in Funding Round (PIF) and the State Allocation Board (SAB) awards the project an apportionment.

Shortly after an authorized District Representative has submitted the Grant Agreement through OPSC Online, an Executive Officer from the OPSC will digitally sign the Grant Agreement and it will be available for download.

OPSC Online allows school districts and applicants to electronically submit requests for funding, and associated project documentation, for all School Facility Program projects. The online platform allows applicants to draft, review, and submit required forms at any time. Our newest release of OPSC Online was released in early July 2020 which added new capabilities that included the New Construction, Modernization, Facility Hardship, Seismic Mitigation Program and the Charter School Facilities Programs. The result is a completely paperless process! We encourage all applicants to submit your applications electronically through OPSC Online instead of submitting a paper based application.
